FACULTY FAQs

Q: Will Penn State adjust its approach to teaching and learning in Fall 2020 if COVID-19 infections increase or spread?

A: The University is concerned about recent trends and continuously monitoring state and national disease data and following guidance from state and local health officials. Based on that guidance, and in consultation with faculty experts in epidemiology, medicine and public health, the University is prepared to adjust its approach as necessary, including the possibility that Penn State would need to shift the semester to a fully remote learning environment.

The [University and Pennsylvania Gov. Tom Wolf](#) have stressed the importance of following guidelines to protect community health and minimize the spread of the virus, and cautioned that lax behaviors could undo progress toward reopening campuses.
